- **Annually support** Southside Medical Center, Sickle Cell Foundation, International Women's House, Hosea Feed the Hungry, MedShare International, Atlanta Community Food Bank and Susan G. Komen since 2014.
- Conduct **Outreach** to Schools in the Metro Atlanta area to educate Students about the Cultural Heritage of Nigeria and Africa.
